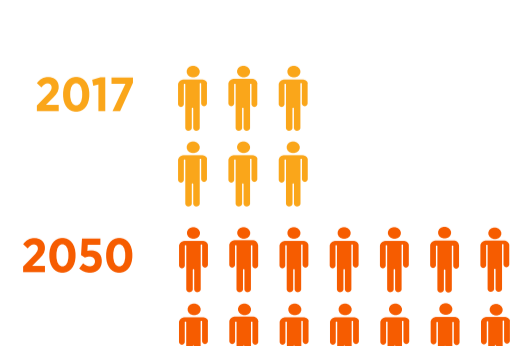
Last mile outreach
